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Founding Principles 2006-2008


The concept for A's & Aces was developed in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina by two former Tulane University student-athletes. One had practiced law for nearly 20 years and the other with academic concentrations in international development and social entrepreneurship. At the time of Katrina, both were coaching the Tulane Women's Tennis Team that they had led from a "neverranked" status to Top 10, while also conducting junior development tennis from entry-level to high-performance.

Tennis helped shape their lives. Their experiences in the sport motivated them to try to make tennis a sport of opportunity for all children in New Orleans.

A's & Aces was incorporated as a nonprofit organization on January 23, 2008. The name "A's & Aces" was selected to symbolize the student-athlete model: specifically, excellence in academics and tennis.

Based on the co-founders' goals to help under-resourced youth and rebuild the City's post-Katrina environment, our mission is "to provide academic assistance, life skills and tennis to New Orleans public school children."

President Clinton Helps Launch A's & Aces

A's & Aces started with a commitment to, and a grant from, Clinton Global Initiative University (CGIU). In 2008, Anna Monhartova - then a PhD candidate at Tulane - attended

the inaugural meeting of CGI U, where she committed A's & Aces to reach students who would not otherwise have the opportunity to play tennis and receive educational support in a structured environment.

President Clinton's remarks:

"After Anna graduates from her program, her PhD program at Payson Institute at Tulane, she plans to give her full-time attention to developing A's & Aces. There aren't many people who'd get a PhD and spend their gifts doing this with it, not to make herself wealthier or more famous, but to empower other people to have a more decent life."

"I know that the studies that show that young people who play sports tend to get better grades, have better social skills and are more likely to lead healthy lifestyles are not myths. They are true, and they are true across the world."

"We also know ... that girls who play sports have better self-esteem, better body image, are less likely to become pregnant as teens, more likely to graduate from high school and college, than those who do not. They're more likely to be self-defining in a very positive way in our culture.... So, this is potentially an affair, not just of the heart, but of the mind, that may be of again lasting import. ... So, let's give Anna Monhartova a big hand." [Applause]





"My uncle dragged me out of the house one summer to go play tennis. ... I gave it a shot and, I fell in love with it. ... It kept me off of the streets. I had a lot of friends who I grew up with who, it turned out, they were into drugs; some were selling drugs, some were using drugs, some went to jail, a couple are even dead. Tennis was my way out; and, I could have been any one of those guys. ...it got me through school, it got me to school in terms of college, going on a scholarship, on a tennis scholarship."

A's & Aces Becomes a NJTL

December 11, 2008 was the last snow day in New Orleans. It was also a memorable day for A's & Aces because the USTA came to New Orleans to invite A's & Aces to become a National Junior Tennis *League* (NJTL) organization.

Arthur Ashe and two others founded the NJTL in 1969. Their vision was to "use tennis as a way to gain and hold the attention of young people...so that we can teach them about matters more important than tennis...Through tennis, lives can be changed and spirits reclaimed."

A few months later, the USTA rebranded the NLTL as "National Junior Tennis & Learning." A's & Aces became one of the 600+ member chapters shortly thereafter, and became eligible for many benefits from the governing body of the sport in the US.





2015 USTA NJTL National Student Athlete Competition

Results based on Academics and Tennis

Twenty-Four (24) A's & Aces student-athletes finished the year top 25 in the (in Four Divisions: Boys/Girls in Elementary/Middle School Divisions)









The USTA NJTL's First Serve Life Skills Curriculum includes:

GAME

The GAME units include: Being a Team Player, Being Positive, Understanding Rules, Practicing Proper Hygiene, Talking with Others and Appreciating Diversity.

SET

The SET units include: Embracing Fitness, Understanding Nutrition, Improving Study Skills, Staying Calm and Focused, Dealing with Peer Pressure and Resolving Conflicts.

MATCH

The MATCH units include: Speaking In Front of Others, Making Good Decisions, Setting Personal Goals, Planning to Attain Personal Goals, Overcoming Challenges and Giving and Receiving Help.

The Impact

Since 2008:

- Impacted thousands of underserved children, while working with 750 children weekly
- **Partnered** with Dillard University, Tulane University, and the New Orleans Recreation Development Commission (NORDC) locally, and with AmeriCorps, the USTA, and Up2Us nationally, to provide classrooms, courts, and coaches and teachers for our youth
- Inspired and exposed hundreds of children to college settings via programs and field trips
- **Promoted** literacy by giving thousands of books to children to build their own home libraries
- Increased fitness through a FUN, life-long, non-contact, co-ed, global, individual & team sport
- **Trained** hundreds of high school, college, and adult volunteers to serve as tutors/role models
- **Employed** full /part- time staff currently 8 full-time and 25 part-time/seasonal staff
- Helped thousands of children learn to read and write more proficiently
- Created forty-three (43) 10 & Under Format Tennis Courts at schools and on public courts
- Introduced thousands of boys and girls to the sport of tennis and exposed them, and the children
 from diverse socio-economic and racial backgrounds with whom they have engage
 competitively and sometimes partnered with, to new experiences and opportunities to
 potentially form cross-cultural, enduring and valuable relationships
- **Empowered** thousands of youth to make positive decisions regarding their own lives, health, education, and futures


A's & Aces 2015 Impact:

- Over 1,000 children regularly participated
- In the 2014-15 academic year, twenty-four (24) A's & Aces student-athletes are ranked top 25 in the in the nation in the USTA National Student-Athlete Competition, including:
 - 11 ranked in the top 10
 - 5 ranked in the top 3, and
 - 2 ranked #1 in the Nation
- 103 participants submitted essays to the national USTA Arthur Ashe Essay Competition and one participant's essay was judged Best in Louisiana, the 5th year in a row that an A's & Aces student-athlete won a trip for 2 to the U.S Open or Winston-Salem Open.
- Over 500 books were distributed to participants in 2015 to create home libraries
- Parent and teacher surveys indicate our participants' increased level of interest in reading and physical fitness
- Service-learning projects completed by A's & Aces participants included: Lemonade Day, Veterans Day, cleanup days at Dillard University, and holiday cards
- Provided in-school enrichment programs daily at four schools (ARISE Academy, Mildred Osborne Charter School, Crocker College Prep and Plessy Community School)
- Daily after-school programs at Dillard University and Joe Brown Park featured our Pathway to College Initiative
- Conducted 5 ½ hours of high-performance clinics each Saturday throughout the school year for tournament-level red, orange, green and yellow ball groups
- A's & Aces hosted five (5) USTA-sanctioned tournaments
- 52 A's & Aces players successfully competed in these tournaments
- 43 A's & Aces players earned USTA Louisiana state rankings
- 48 weeks of programming per year
- 7 full time staff members, 25 part time/seasonal staff members, and about 120 volunteers and servicelearners worked and served as role models for our children
- 28 A's & Aces coaches participated in the USTA Coaches Workshop 5 coaches are now USPTA/PTR certified


